

The Prayerful Pause

December is finally here! It's hard to believe that 2023 is almost over. Before we blink, we will be ringing in 2024. But before we turn another page on the calendar, let me share some of the wonderful things taking place in worship during the Season of Advent!

This year, Advent begins on Sunday, December 3. During Advent, we will eagerly prepare for Jesus' arrival, making rooming our hearts and in our lives for him. We also prepare our Sanctuary for Christmas each year as we celebrate the Hanging of the Greens on the First Sunday of Advent. This year, we will have our Hanging of the Greens Service on Sunday morning. Before the service at 10:00 AM, we hope you will join us for a fellowship time with the Union Family in the Fellowship Hall and bring a snack to share. Spending time together in fellowship is a great way to kick off the Advent Season.

During the four weeks of Advent, our theme in worship will be "Rerouted," and we will focus on the many ways that God directed and re-directed people in the Christmas story. I am especially excited about this sermon series as it reminds us to keep our eyes, ears, hearts, and minds open to the new things God wants to do in our lives.

On December 20 at 6:00 PM, we will hold our second annual Blue Christmas Service to reach out to those grieving in the church and the wider community. You may not have heard of a Blue Christmas Service before, but it's a service that speaks especially to people grieving loss during this time of year. You may know a friend or neighbor who is grieving the loss of a loved one or who is grieving another type of loss, including a recent divorce or job transition. Our Blue Christmas service will acknowledge the heaviness that people often feel during this season while pointing to the hope that Jesus brings even as we grieve. Please pray that God will use our Blue Christmas service to comfort those feeling blue this season.

Our music ministry will lead us in worship on Sunday, December 17, as the story of Christ is told through song and readings. We also look forward to our candlelight Christmas Eve service on Sunday, December 24, at 5:00 PM. Since Christmas Eve is also on Sunday this year, we will have a family-friendly service for all ages at 11:00 AM on Christmas Eve that morning, too. There will be no Sunday School on Christmas Eve.

I hope you will invite a friend or neighbor to visit Union for any of our services during December. It will be a rich and meaningful month of worship. During December, there are also a host of fellowship and service opportunities for all age groups in the Union Family. You can find more information about these fellowship and service opportunities sprinkled throughout these pages. It will be a joyous month as we watch and wait for Christ. May the joy of Jesus fill our hearts this December as we worship, serve, and fellowship together.



Columbarium Task Force Committee Update

from the Church Council

Thank you for your participation in the recent Columbarium Survey. We received 50 responses.

The Columbarium survey data indicate the Union Christian Congregation is interested in moving forward with columbarium planning. Please see the graphs below for more information on the data.

The survey results were presented to the Church Council for consideration at the November meeting. The Columbarium Task Force recommended that the Council appoint a Phase 2 Columbarium Committee to develop a concept design and cost estimate for a Union Church Columbarium, which upon development, will be presented to the Council and Congregation for consideration and approval. The Council approved this recommendation and the Council Chairperson will be working to recruit these committee members and present their names to the Council at the January meeting.





Family Promise Update

Great news for Family Promise of Athens! They have recently received a \$400,000 grant from the Bezos Day 1 Families Fund. This is the largest private gift in FPA's history. FPA was one of 38 nonprofits across the United States to receive a grant. This round of giving from the Bezos Day 1 Families Fund totaled



more than \$117 million. Since its inception in 2018, the Bezos Day 1 Families Fund has granted more than \$630 million to organizations helping families who are experiencing homelessness. FPA plans to use the funds in its diversion program that helps families with upfront barriers to housing such as security deposits, car repairs, or employment expenses. The funding will also help FPA double its shelter program capacity on Magnolia Terrace in Athens by the end of 2024.

Our last host week of 2023 is December 3-10. This will be our last hosting week at Milledge Avenue Baptist Church (MABC). We thank MABC for partnering with FPA the last two years as FPA moved to a static site hosting model. As mentioned in last month's newsletter, FPA is transitioning hosting models once again. As of this writing, we do not have our hosting calendar for 2024. Those dates and more final details of what hosting will look like will be forthcoming.

Thank you to all our faithful volunteers who served over this past year. We were able to step up and host 5 weeks rather than our usual 4 weeks per year. We appreciate the time you have given to FPA in preparing meals or spending time on site at MABC. Thanks to our congregation for financially supporting FPA and continuing to pray for this ministry serving our homeless neighbors. Please continue praying for a smooth transition into this next hosting model in 2024.

One last reminder: La Tablé is the biggest fundraiser of the year for FPA. The 2024 La Tablé fundraiser will be on **Tuesday**, **February 6**, **2024**, at 11:00 AM. This year's event will be at a new location—1055 Barber, a new event space in Athens. Once again, Union is heading up the annual bake sale and clergy cook off. Union bakers, we will be in touch soon!
