During November, I want to encourage you to spend some time prayerfully reflecting on the many ways God has blessed Union in 2023. Here is a short list of things we can thank God for as a church family this Thanksgiving!

- Thank God for the worship, fellowship, and service that fills our lives with joy as we seek to follow Christ together!
- We've welcomed five new members by transfer of letter in 2023: David Lovell, Madison and Adam Fitzgerald, and Pam and Larry Gunter. We've welcomed 2 new members by baptism, Noah Whitehurst and Cora Sledge. We've also welcomed several new active participants into the community this year!
- We've had several opportunities to reach out to young families in our community through Fall Family Fun Night, Vacation Bible School, Parents Night Out, and the Easter Egg Hunt. God has graciously grown our Ministry to Children and Youth over the last year as well!
- God continues to use our GriefShare Ministry, providing comfort and care for the
 participants through our extraordinary leaders. God has even grown this ministry,
 allowing us to partner with our friends at Presbyterian Village to host a safelight
 group this fall.
- Our Young Adult Hangout Group continues to be an excellent way for our young folks to stay connected and find an outlet for Christian fellowship.
- In addition to Sunday School, we offered 3 small group Bible Studies, 2 groups for women and 1 group for men, in the winter, spring, and fall. We've seen participants in the women's Bible Studies from the wider community. We also had a meaningful Soup and Study during Lent.
- Our Disciples Men spent a day serving at Camp Christian last spring, and they just held a dinner to enjoy fellowship and learn more about the ministry of ACTS.
- Many volunteers in the church family regularly serve with ACTS, and we are thankful for their support of this life-giving ministry.
- Our Tuesday morning craft group has made 1,435 fleece comfort pillows to encourage people undergoing medical treatments. They are now diligently working on some amazing new Chrismons for our Sanctuary Tree!
- Union has spent 4 weeks providing meals and serving as hosts to support Family Promise of Athens, with a fifth week on the horizon in December.
- Your giving to our Fifth Sunday Benevolence Offerings has helped families in need in our local community 31 times this year. You've also shared 40 Easter Food boxes, and we plan to share around 50 food boxes with families this Thanksgiving.
- You've generously given supplies and money to support 12 different Christian Women's Fellowship Projects throughout the year, impacting families in our community and around the world.

Indeed, we have much to be thankful for as a church family! I hope you will spend some time this month thanking God for all these good gifts in our life and ministry together!

Family Promise Update

We are ending the year with a full Family Promise schedule. Mark your calendars for a benefit piano concert by Ken Medema on Sunday, November 12, in the sanctuary of Milledge Avenue Baptist Church. A suggested donation of \$10 per attendee is appreciated. Donations may be made at the door by cash, check or card. All proceeds from "ticket" sales go directly to FPA.



Our final host week of 2023 at Milledge Ave. Baptist Church is December 3 - 10. Regular volunteers, be on the lookout for a signup email coming in the next weeks.

Save the date for La Tablé, FPA's largest fundraiser, on Tuesday, February 6, from 11:00 AM—1:00 PM. The event is changing to a new, larger venue since we have outgrown the Athens Country Club. The 2024 La Tablé will be held at 1055 Barber, Lee Epting's new event space in Athens. Union and our support congregations hope to fill two tables. Kelly and Patti will once again coordinate the Silent Auction Bake Sale and Clergy Bake-off. In 2024, FPA will celebrate 20 years of working to support local families with children who are facing or experiencing the crisis of homelessness.

For 2024 we will once again be practicing **flexibility** as our hosting model is changing again. Being flexible has served us very well since we began volunteering and supporting Family Promise of Athens. The 2024 FPA Shelter Plan is explained below this article. We do not expect switching hosting models to be an exact science. We understand that timelines are approximate and many puzzle pieces have to fall into place for the transition to happen. Like we have done so well in the past, **we will be flexible and modify** as the situations dictate. Please include FPA in your prayers as we seek God's guidance on how we can best serve our neighbors facing homelessness.

FAMILY PROMISE HOSTING PLAN 2024

FPA Shelter 2020-2023

Since the Pandemic, Family Promise has worked to adapt our shelter program in order to continuously serve families experiencing homelessness. For the past 3 years, the program has been run using a static shelter site, primarily at Milledge Avenue Baptist Church.

Since 2020, the number of host congregations has decreased from 17 to 11, increasing the number of open weeks each year to 10 weeks, where FPA staff work to get volunteers to fill open slots. Filling all 26 slots a week has become increasingly difficult, and we foresee losing at least 1 additional congregation in 2024. With the changing times, FPA must adapt to continue to best serve families and provide meaningful volunteer opportunities. At the end of 2023, we will close the MABC shelter location. Until then, we will work diligently to find stable housing for current guests, and we will work on cleaning and moving out our items from the space.

FPA Plans for 2024

The new shelter location will be 158 and 164 Magnolia Terrace. These units are currently used as FPA transitional housing units. Using these units will provide families with their own space and allow them to learn important rental skills like cleaning and maintenance. We believe that this approach will better equip families to transition to the private market.

FPA Plans for 2024 Continued

We plan to fundraise \$150,000 in 2024 to renovate a duplex next door to these units to increase the number of families we can serve. Fundraising is currently underway.

Congregation and Volunteer Involvement

We believe that congregational and volunteer involvement is still an imperative part of this new shelter model. We want volunteer opportunities with this new approach to better match the wants of volunteers with the needs of families. There will still be host weeks for each congregation, but the volunteer opportunities will be different. We will no longer ask volunteers to monitor the location or sleep overnight. Instead, there will be a spectrum of activities to meet the different desires of each congregation. Prior to your host week, you will receive a menu of options, and your congregation can fulfill as many of the needs as you are able.

What will be the opportunities for volunteering in 2024? During your congregation's host week, you will be given the opportunity to:

- Provide a grocery or rideshare gift card to the families (\$25 per person)
- Provide household/hygiene supplies to the families
- Provide family needs (work boots for a new job, backpacks for school etc.)
- Bring a meal or cook a meal with the families (two meal slots per week)
- Plan a children's activity for the kids (Read a book or help with homework)
- Take the families to a movie night at the theater
- Host the families at your church for a group activity
- Host an activity based on the season (pumpkin carving, Easter egg hunt, etc.)
- Mentoring opportunities with parents (financial literacy, resume building)
- Van Driving for an afternoon (help with appointments: DMV, housing, interviews)

How will we keep the units safe and clean?

- Each unit will have front and backdoor cameras
- No outside guests will be allowed in the units, Tenaja will monitor cameras
- Units will be subject to one unannounced cleanliness check a week by Clyde
- Families will meet twice a week at the unit with Tenaja for case management

What services will Family Promise staff provide to families?

- Families will have a 4-month maximum in the unit
- Families will actively participate in case management
- Families will receive referrals and access to additional agencies as needed
- Families will be signed up for all eligible government benefits
- Families will receive help with the housing search

Thanksgiving Offering

The Christian Church (DOC) collects a yearly Thanksgiving Offering to support to Disciples colleges, universities, and theological institutions. Thanksgiving Food Boxes

Thanksgiving is right around the corner, and Union Christian Church is providing Thanksgiving boxes for families this holiday Season. Counselors at Oconee County Schools have helped us identify families who are in need this Thanksgiving. We hope you will sign up to fill 1-2 boxes. You can pick up an instruction sheet and prayer guide when you sign up. Union will supply the turkey to complete your box. All boxes are due on November 12. We hope that you will sign up and help Union to bless our community in a big way this Thanksgiving.





Thanksgiving Box Distribution

Union will distribute Thanksgiving Boxes on Sunday, November 19, and we will need volunteers to help show God's love. If you are available to help on November 19, please contact the church office or Kay Smith.

Permanent Fund News

Union is blessed to have the Congregational Permanent Fund to support ongoing ministry and missions in the local area and beyond. The Congregational Permanent Fund policy determines the percentage of investment income available for annual distribution. The Permanent Fund Committee is charged with fund oversight and also with developing a recommendation to the Church Council about which ministry organizations and missions projects to support.

The Permanent Fund Committee will be developing the 2023-2024 funding recommendations during the next few months. At this time, the Church Council has approved \$20,000 for distribution.

We request your assistance to identify ministry organizations and mission projects for funding consideration. This is an opportunity for Union to dream about how we can best share God's love with those in need.
